Bird Island Park

Description:	Bird Island Park opened in 2010. It is the result of hard-working volunteers
= 200p.u.	who made a concerted effort to provide a beautiful nature walk and park
	for residents. It is a beautiful replica of bird habitats as well. A stroll
	through the park begins at the Gazebo and then through a turtle-shaped
	hedge maze of native plantings. As you pass the maze, to the right is a
	water feature with a bird rookery and second gazebo surrounded by a
	boardwalk. Continuing beyond the maze is a section of native hammock
	with an inviting bird bath. Many birds pass through this area every day.
	Bird Island is a relatively small park. However, the peaceful environment
	and the high likelihood of seeing birds and other wildlife makes it a very
	popular place for birders.
