Gourd Island Conservation Area

Description:	The Florida Department of Transportation acquired this property in December 2010 and later donated it to the St. Johns River Water Management District. This conservation area provides significant water resource protection for Durbin and Sampson creeks, which border the property to the north. One of the special highlights of this property is the fantastic swamp that the trails bisect. The swamp forms a gourd-shaped island, giving Gourd Island its name. The center part of the property rises high above the swamp to provide some wonderful upland habitats. This center "island" area has been part of a sandhill restoration project since 2012. There are two main trails, a Red Blaze trail which is 2.5 miles round trip and a White Blaze trail which is .8-mile one way.
