Stokes Landing Conservation Area

Description:	Stokes Landing is a conservation area within the coastal basin of the Tolomato River, purchased to protect water resources, wetlands and wildlife habitat. The area is important because it is adjacent to the Guana-Tolomato-Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve (GTM-NERR). In conjunction with several other public lands nearby, this property 227-acre property protects water quality, indigenous plants, birds and animals, as well as cultural resources. One of the special highlights of this property is an observation platform for viewing wildlife and the marsh that overlooks the GTM-NERR. Because this can be a wet area, during warmer and humid weather, the bugs will be numerous. You should consider wearing long pants, long sleeves and/or bring an effective bug repellent.
