## **Vilano Boat Ramp**

Description:	Situated in the middle of a salt marsh, with mudflats, oyster bars and open water habitats, this boat ramp and parking area at the west end of the Vilano Bridge provide great viewing opportunities for shorebirds, gulls, terns and wading birds. Low tide and spring/fall migration are the best times to visit. This site can be especially good during or after rains – just bird right from your car. Also check the mudflats across the road from the sidewalk for more shorebirds and waders (a scope is handy here). When motorized boat traffic is low, you may wish to paddle the marsh for additional viewing opportunities.

Species:	169 species have been found. In the winter, loons and ducks. Year around, Clapper Rail, Black Skimmer, Roseate Spoonbill. Whimbrel, Marbled Godwit, American Avocet, and White-rumped Sandpiper have been found here during migration. Pelagic seabirds such as Sooty and Bridled Terns during stormy weather.
