Welaka State Forest

Description:	The lovely Welaka State Forest contains two springs, and
MAP Mud Spring Trail	approximately 4 miles of river frontage on the St. Johns River. The Forest is divided by CR 309. The forest area west of CR 309 contains 1 educational trail and two hiking trails (Mud Spring and John's Landing). The forest trails east of CR 309 are designated as multiple use, although mainly used by equestrian riders.
Forest Education Trail Welaka SF Trail Map	 From the parking area south of headquarters the (unpaved) Forest Education Trail provides a good interpretation of the forest's habitats and wildlife. The John's Landing Trailhead is off of the Education Trail and leads south for more than 4 miles. Look for Wild Turkeys, Northern Bobwhites, migrating flocks of migrating warblers and Florida Sandhill Cranes nesting in the ephemeral wetlands. Bald Eagles nest nearby and frequently fly over the property. The Mud Spring Trail is almost 2 miles long, and its entrance is north of the Forest Education Trail.
